We were in Mr. Lindbloom's and Miss Kelly's ungraded classroom together . His dad always knew it was time to take us to school because the TV would blair "Good Morning Captain, Captain Kangaroo". But he not only had to hear the song he had to sing it to us every morning. He was a joker and " I remember following him all over the house one time being a human Polish trailer " .(PC was not quite as in back then and my father just lol when he came to pick me up. There assessment of me I think was" full of talent but a little naive" and they both had a good lol. Kevin lives in New Orleans now and I wish I had known this sooner because I would have gone to the Goskey Center on Sunday to pay my respects. But most of all I remember him as a really good parent who gave his son the space to grow and to become the really smart talented individual he is today. He bought us Wacky Package Stickers, and great posters for his room he let Kevin listen to Punk bands like the B 52 bombers "Rock Lobster" he rented the Dianza theatre for his son's birthday party and we saw "Godzilla" on the large screen and had the theatre and all the popcorn a classroom could eat flowed from the concession stand. These were some of the best qualities Jack exhibited he took us to the Rose Parade and we to baseball games the A's stadium even though Kevin and I were not interested in his beloved sport. And he created a child that had read out the Marcy Library and moved onto the downtown one before we had even gotten out of grammar school . He dropped us at midnight showings of Rocky Horror went to see my classical music concerts and attended Kevin's theater performances as we

got older. I hope this reminds the family of some of the great things we did with Jack because I only knew this side of the man and it was some of his best qualities not the fact that he was a war hero . I lost my mom earlier this month age 75 and my dad in high school at age 45. My hope for today would be that they have met up again and are swapping stories, and of course exchanging a friendly game of pool.
